


## FR LIONEL XAVIER'S SPECIAL SUPPLEMENT

As an important icon of Rosaryhill School, we certainly have lost a great leader but we certainly will












TOP LEFT: WAKE FUNERAL MASS AT MACAU CATHOLIC FUNERAL HOME ON 19/10/2011

## **Brief Biographical Notes of Fr Lionel Xavier**

1930

Born in Hong Kong

1956	Joined the Order as a novice at St. Albert's Priory, Hong Kong
1959	Transferred to Manila to continue studies
1963	Ordained as priest on 27 April 1963
1966	Appointed as the Principal for 3 sections of Rosaryhill School
1967-90	Principal of Secondary Section
1993-97	Principal of Primary and Secondary Sections
2004	Retired from Rosaryhill School
2004	Appointed as Superior of St. Dominic's House and Director of Religious Department at Escola Sao Paolo
2011	Passed away at around 5:15am on 19 October 2011 in Macau

# In memory of Father Xavier – Edwin WL Ginn, class of 1974

Didn't realise that it is so difficult to write about Father Xavier and keeping it short. Still, I have promises to keep but where shall I begin and how dare I disturb his universe? Shall I write about the welcoming change from a rather harsh and cool Primary Principal (my impression only) to a warm and engaging fatherly figure? Or about the happy days as an altar boy under his mentorship; the adventurous outings, the hikes and camps with 'Lao Xa'? Or corresponding with the 'Old Dog' during my college years that kept me going while I was studying abroad; the infrequent but regular, yet most memorable dinners with the 'Old Devil' throughout my working career? I have selected below but only two of our meetings but I think that would suffice.

The first was a visit with my family to RHS when my kids were still young. Visits to the school were not uncommon but a guided tour of the rooftop garden and greenhouse by Father was a rare treat. Father Xavier's eyed beamed with enthusiasm and explained to us how he nurtured his favourite plants and flowers, especially the orchids that he secretly smuggled from the Mainland. Even devoted priests were liable to sin once in a blue moon! He took much pleasure in watering, weeding and fertilising the plants; witnessing the growth and well being of his plants. We were astounded not only by the beauty and health of the plants and flowers but also by his blissful smile in seeing the healthy growth of his garden, and perhaps of us too.

The second was a lunch at the Educational Restaurant in Macau a day after his 2011 birthday. There were no signs of decaying health then. His signature iron grip handshake was still impressive and I assumed that he was fine and in good health, just a tad overweight. He was a very happy man in Macau, looking after potential young Dominican priests, free from the vagaries and worries of managing a school. We took photos and had a most happy and enjoyable lunch. This turned out to be the last that we would see of him in good health before the downturn of events, his ailing struggle in hospital upon his return to Hong Kong and in St Dominic's Priory in Macau and his ultimate departure. The mournings, not yet completely gone, are gradually waning and healing with time.

Father Xavier lived and preached by example, leading a holy, humble, healthy, simple and yet happy life; shying of material processions, helping others to do good, contributing positively to those around him, to Church and society. Old man, you live forever in our memories. We will visit you from time to time and you will be a constant source of strength and inspiration for all of us.
